Three Pillars



ENVIRONMENTAL

A company's impact on the environment, including energy use, waste management, pollution, greenhouse gas emissions, deforestation, carbon emissions, and use of recycled materials



SOCIAL

A company's labor practices, human rights reporting, DE&I, employee health and safety, and child/forced labor prevention. Includes sourcing safety of the product produced for manufacturing companies.



GOVERNANCE

A company's ethics and business practices, corporate behavior and controls. Includes whistleblowing, anticorruption, and information security.



Important Difference

ESG is a measured assessment of sustainability using benchmarks and metrics.

Its main purpose is to provide stakeholders and investors with a framework to assess a company's impact on society, the environment, and its corporate governance practices.

Sustainability is a broad principle that encompasses responsible business practices.

It includes operating a business in a way that meets the economic, social, and environmental needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.


Case Study: ADP
